

Brunei Darussalam - Pet Import Permit: How to Apply

For dogs and cats.

A valid import permit issued by the Biosecurity and Market Access Division is required to import a dog or cat into Brunei Darussalam. Requirements differ by exporting country (schedule vs non-schedule) - see the requirements list below.

How to apply

The import permit is applied for by a registered Forwarding Agent (under Royal Customs) through the Brunei Darussalam National Single Window (login.bdns.gov.bn). Prepare:

- An ISO-compliant microchip (number recorded on all documents).
- A Veterinary Health Certificate dated within 14 days, endorsed on every page by an official government veterinarian of the exporting country.
- Vaccination records and external + internal parasite-treatment records (2-7 days before the flight).
- For non-schedule countries: rabies vaccination + a rabies titer result (at least 0.5 IU/ml).

Processing time: 3 working days.

Fee: B\$7 per permit (one permit per consignment).

Permit validity: 3 months (air/sea) or 30 days (land posts).

Notice of Arrival: 7 days before arrival.

Requirements confirmed by the authority (8 August 2026)

- Schedule countries (Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, UK, Singapore): NO rabies vaccination/titer and NO quarantine (rabies-free origin, pet resident 6 months or since birth).
- Non-schedule countries (all others): the requirements below apply.
- Microchip: required (ISO-compliant).
- Rabies vaccination (non-schedule): required - primary at least 60 days before travel (animal 3 months+), or booster within 1 year.
- Rabies antibody (titer) test (non-schedule): required, at least 0.5 IU/ml.
- General vaccination: dogs - distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus; cats - cat flu and cat enteritis (14 days to 1 year before travel).
- Veterinary health certificate: required, dated within 14 days, government-endorsed.
- Parasite treatment: external (ticks/fleas) and internal (worms) 2-7 days before the flight.
- Quarantine (non-schedule): 14 days (with a satisfactory titer) or 30 days (vaccinated only) at a Government facility, then home quarantine to 6 months. Free of charge.
- Banned dog breeds: Pit Bull types, Akita, Boerboel, Dogo Argentino, Fila Brasileiro, Neapolitan Mastiff, Tosa, Perro de Presa Canario.
- Restricted dog breeds (conditions apply): Bull Mastiff, Bull Terrier, Doberman, Rottweiler, German Shepherd/Alsatian.
- Cats: Bengal and Savannah crosses must be 5th generation or later.
